CANADIAN CHALLENGE CUP Men's Club Championship

The first national club championship, arranged by the Dominion Football Association of Canada was held in 1913 for the Connaught Cup. It was suspended from 1916 – 1918 for World War 1. The first BC finalist was Ladysmith in 1921. Competition was suspended between 1940 and 1945 for World War 2, since when the competition has been played for the Challenge Cup.
